Helping Others

This feels natural **if you enjoy answering questions or giving advice.**

You don't need to be an expert—you just need to be one step ahead of someone else.

👉 Good fit if: people already come to you for help or you like being useful.

👍 **So... which is easiest?**

For most people starting out:

👉 **Staying organized is usually the easiest.**

Why? Because:

- There's less pressure to be “creative”
 - You're just arranging things, not inventing them
 - It feels simple and low-stress

💡 **Simple way to decide:**

Ask yourself this one question:

“Which one feels the least stressful to try today?”

That's your answer.

Start there. You can always add the others later.
